ABOUT REV. DR. PAIGE STEPHAN

Paige L. Stephan is a board-certified staff chaplain at Rush University Medical Center and is faculty as an assistant professor in the College of Health Sciences. She is an ordained Minister of Word and Sacrament with the Presbyterian Church (USA) and was the Moderator of Chicago Presbytery in 2019.

After her time as an undergraduate Boilermaker, she served as a Young Adult Volunteer in the East African office of Church World Service in Nairobi, Kenya. It was during this year that she discovered her abiding love of stories and came to cherish the work of receiving and holding them in shared sacred space. Paige returned to the Midwest and received her Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry from McCormick Theological Seminary where her doctoral thesis focused on resilience in a healthcare setting.

Westminster Presbyterian church is her home church and where she adorned angel wings for the living nativity, played volleyball, enjoyed mission trips and lock-ins, and learned about God's abiding love in community. Paige is married to Kevin, and they are both kept on their toes chasing a beautifully silly and energetic toddler, Adelia – who was baptized at Westminster just this past fall.
